

2018 Upper Sullivan Run Sewer Rehabilitation Project

State Pipe Services of Cranberry Township, PA has been contracted by the Butler Area Sewer Authority (BASA) to perform sewer line rehabilitation work in portions of Center Township. This work may consist of closed-circuit television (CCTV) inspections, open excavations, or trenchless repairs of the public sanitary sewers. Here is an illustration of what the outside and inside of a typical CCTV truck looks like:



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The primary purpose of this work is to stop the migration of storm and ground water, often referred to as Inflow and Infiltration (I/I), into the sanitary sewer system. I/I can enter the public sewer system in situations where damage may have inadvertently been caused by other parties to the main line sewer since it was originally installed. Damages such as this:



CCTV makes locating such situations possible. All work will take place within existing sanitary sewer easements. Any disturbed areas from this work will be restored in a timely and professional manner. Work is expected to start on or about June 18, 2018 and will continue through September. More specific dates of when work will start in each neighborhood, along with the site superintendent's contact information, will be provided with a door hanger at the service address as the project start date approaches.

The portions of sewer lines needing repair are generally near Sunset Drive to the north, East Brewster Road to the south, Mercer Road to the east, and McCandless Road to the west.
